## Arrival & Dismissal Assembly Areas

Each division has a designated area to assemble in the morning when the buses arrive, and at the end of the day before dismissal. **Turtles & Freshmen– Twin Cedars, Sophs– Lunch Tent, Juniors– Lakeside Amphitheater, Seniors– Senior Stage (near Point Pavilion), Teen Leadership CITs - the Willows and LITs - the Vista.** At the meeting areas you check in with your Groups at your table/bench, hear important announcements from Division Leaders and place your lunch order. At the June "Meet & Greet," you can meet your Group Leader & Counselors at your assembly area! **Monday mornings and Friday afternoons, the whole camp meets at the Amphitheater!**

## Backwards Bridge

There are two bridges that cross Craft's Creek at Liberty Lake, and the smaller one to the east MUST be traversed... BACKWARDS! If you don't, you will hear about it from many of our younger, rule-following campers- It's bad luck to cross forwards, and legend is that a troll used to live under the bridge, from when the Renaissance Faire took place at LLDC.

## Before / After Care

This is what we call camp time for the Campers who arrive before the buses arrive in the morning, and/or stay at Camp after the bus dismissal in the afternoon. During this time, Campers enjoy themselves in and around the Twin Cedars area and some even swim again in the afternoon. It's fun "unstructured" time where campers can be creative and build new relationships!

**Big Pete** is the resident turtle who used to live- or might still live- under the BIG bridge. Those who have seen him say he is as big as Crush in *Finding Nemo*. We haven't seen him lately, but there are many "Pete stories" about this Liberty Lake legend, and his offspring (kids) are all over the lake!



**Brandi "BC"** is the camp director who oversees the program. She worked as a counselor for the YMCA Camp that rented Liberty Lake before Andy started LLDC in 2002- the only person hired from the prior camp- making Brandi the longest running staff member at Liberty Lake (one more than Andy!) Brandi personifies the Liberty Lake Spirit with her enthusiasm, energy, and creativity. **BUDDY CHECK!!!** While at the Pool and Lake, during Free Swim, we keep track of our Campers through *the Buddy Check System*. Each Camper is paired up with another camper, and sometimes a third. They swim together and keep a close watch on each other. Once or twice during the swim periods, the Lifeguards will call "**Buddy- ----Check!**" During which it is really important to be responsible and quiet while listening to directions. The Lifeguards will call out each pair of campers, and campers will say "**HERE!**" When all Campers are accounted for, the Lifeguards announce that it is safe to swim again. Buddy Check is our most important safety system at Swim, and everyone needs to help make sure that it runs quickly and safely!

## The Bus, Bus Captains, & Bus Spirit Trophy

Camp buses are like school buses, except they have air-conditioning (and seat belts), and we have way more fun! Each bus has a number and animal mascot to help you remember which bus you're on. Buses line up in the same row every afternoon, with a "street sign" at the end of the row that displays your bus mascot. Bus counselors are called "Bus Captains" and help ensure that the ride to and from Camp is safe and enjoyable. Camp begins as soon as you get onto the bus, with a daily bus calendar of fun games and competitions. We award spirit and safety points each day when the buses pull into Camp. The bus that shows the most creativity and spirit each week receives the coveted bus trophy filled with blue slushie- and gets their picture taken on stage at the Friday Assembly!



## Camp-A-Palooza

A special event held Week 8, Camp-a-Palooza is an annual music and arts festival (a mini-Woodstock) held on the fields at Liberty Lake, with professional, staff, and camper bands performing throughout the afternoon. Besides the music, the festival is the perfect opportunity for Liberty Lakers to be creative, and reflect on their camp friendships while celebrating another awesome summer. The day is brought to a close with the house band, the camper band, and guest musicians collaborating on a cool version of the Liberty Lake Song. It's a wonderful afternoon to celebrate our camp family and friends!



**Color War** is one of our most popular events at Liberty Lake. The 3-day tournament begins with a **surprise breakout** (Nobody knows when it takes place) that is VERY anticipated and exciting! The Camp is divided into teams with opportunities to demonstrate integrity, teamwork and spirit throughout the summer. Competitions are built into our Electives and Spirit Events, and it “**All comes down to The Sing**” in which the teams perform a skit, cheer, and song for BIG points. No matter who wins, Color War is always a chance for campers and staff to show their spirit and character- *if you're in 3rd grade and up, you and your family members remain on the same team... FOR LIFE – but not in 2026- as we have a special 2-team competition planned...*

## Counselors

Each camper group has one or two Counselors 16 and 17 years old entering 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade High School students. Counselors assist Group Leaders and their primary job is to play with the campers while learning to become good leaders. Many Liberty Lakers aspire to become Counselors themselves one day, and more than half of them were campers- excited to play it forward!!

## Deep-Water Test + Swim Bands/Bracelets & Headbands

If you want to swim in the deep end of the pool, go on the water slides, or the deep end of the lake and the dock, then you need to take the **Deep Water Swim Tests** with the Lifeguards, and wear the appropriate swim band. Prove you are a strong enough swimmer, and you'll have access to deep water FUN! Shallow lake swimmers use headbands linking to our **digital aquatic safety equipment!**



## Divisions & Division Leaders

Liberty Lake Day Camp is divided into SIX divisions. From youngest to oldest our divisions are called: **Turtles** (Pre-K & K), **Freshmen/Frosh** (1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>), **Sophomores/Sophs** (3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup>), **Juniors** (5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>), **Seniors** (7<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup>) and **Teen Leadership** CIT/LIT (9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>) Divisions split into groups of campers, each named after a college. Each division has **Division Leaders**, and some have “Assistant Division Leaders.” Their job is to make sure that everything runs smoothly at Camp, mentor their staff, communicate with parents, and report to the head counselors and Andy every day.

**Davey Jones** is our amazing Pirate Ship Playground- **AHOY MATEY!**

**Dietary Specialist** is the person who makes sure that kids with food allergies and other dietary needs, get the right food they need for lunch, snacks, and even in “Taste Buds” class!

**Duke's Glen** is the small stage and assembly area, between the lunch tent & barbecue area. The Freshman division meets there before and after electives, and it's used for performances with campers and staff.



## Dunk Tank

Campers take turns sitting on the bench above the icy cold water, while others take turns throwing a ball at the target. If the ball hits the target, the person on the bench falls into the water. They are so popular that the camp owns TWO of them- Kids love the dunk tank- Dunking friends, and getting dunked themselves!

## Electives

Campers, entering 1<sup>st</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> grade, choose activities each week they attend LLDC. Links to the new elective sheets are Emailed to families for the following week. By Monday night, you and your parents need to log into your account and submit your TOP 10 choices of electives. When you come to Camp the following Monday, your group leader gives you your schedule for that week based on your choices. Try new things- because you could always switch out!

## Family Night

Your whole family is invited to come out to LLDC on the Wednesday night of Week 7 (rain date, Thursday) from 5:30-8pm. Join us for a delicious BBQ dinner and participate in some of our favorite activities across Camp. **Parents- Wear your sneakers!** Hang out with our awesome staff, enjoy the Camp Musical, and at 7pm, we hold our “Old-Timer's Club” 5, 10, 15, 20, & 25 year presentations. The whole family is invited out for a great evening of fun- regardless of your weeks attending!



**Feather & Fur** is a popular elective incorporating animal care with an assortment of our feathered and furry friends like chickens and goats. We've had campers (who don't even have pets at home) who have become veterinarians because of F & F!

**Free Choice** is a daily period dedicated to unstructured play. It's a chance for campers to decompress, be creative, and develop social skills, independently. It's a great balance to our elective program and allows kids time to play or chill- their choice!



**Friday Assembly** is an extra special time at Liberty Lake. At the end of each Friday, the entire Camp gathers at the Amphitheater to celebrate a great week. Campers get the opportunity to share and perform what they've learned - Dancers, Cheerleaders, Rockers, Rappers – this is the place to show your friends what you got! We also award fuzzies to deserving campers and team members, the bus spirit trophy is presented, we enjoy an ice cream treat and sing a rousing rendition of the Liberty Lake song! Performances are recorded and uploaded to YouTube for all to enjoy!

### Fuzzies / FuzzyMan!

At Camp we believe in the importance of teaching and having strong character values. When campers do or say something REALLY AWESOME that shows our Star Points, they can be awarded a Fuzzy. Those who show truly exceptional character are recognized at the Friday assembly in front of the whole camp. Fuzzies are very special and serve as a reminder that we all should try and be the best person we can! **FuzzyMan** is our Camp Mascot, spreading cheer, character, & community amongst the camp!



**GA-GA** is BY FAR the most popular activity at Camp. It is a cross between Dodgeball, Handball, and Gladiator, played in an 8-sided court. The object is to slap the ball with your hand in an attempt to hit other players below the waist while not getting hit yourself. If a person is hit, they are out of the game- but games go QUICKLY. The last person standing is the winner! Ga-Ga can be chosen as an elective, played at before/after care, or as a Free Choice activity. Each summer we have our annual Ga-Ga tournament. Every Camper is welcome to participate, and everyone has a chance to win! At the end of that day, we have a "Tournament of Champions" with all of the divisional winners. In 2003 a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader won it all, and a few campers have won the tournament twice!

### Gate Guards

Your safety is a top priority at camp, and our driveway gate guards make sure that no one gets on campus without us knowing who they are. Our friends at the gate are there to keep us safe, start our day with a smile, and help dismissals run smoothly!

### Group Leader

Every group is led by a Group Leader- a college student or young teacher, who is the adult in charge of the group. Group Leaders take attendance and lunch orders in the morning, and ensure the well-being and happiness of all the campers in their respective group- while modeling and reinforcing our character values. Many Group Leaders are also activity leaders during elective periods.

### Health Center

Our Nurses are found in the Health Center to take care of you if you don't feel well or get a boo-boo. They also keep any medicine that you bring to Camp and need to take during the day. ### High Ropes Adventure *(3<sup>rd</sup> Graders and older)*

The high ropes structures at Camp challenge kids' athleticism and courage. Our two-level Vertical Playground, Two Zip Lines, a GIANT swing, "Leap of Faith," and a low ropes course teaches collaboration, trust, respect, and aspiration. The zip lines are over 600 feet long and fly over the far end of Liberty Lake, over the heads of boaters. When you land on the other side, you take the RETURN Zip line back! The Giant Swing swings over the lake, over boats! High Ropes staff are specially trained/certified to be Spiderman superheroes!

**Hulla-Ball** is the Liberty Lake version of the popular playground game "Four-Square," played on a court made of four equal-sized squares. The object of the game is to hit the ball to another Camper in another square without it going out of the lines of the court. After only one bounce, the next Camper needs to then hit the ball out of his square into another. It's just as addictive as Ga-Ga! If you mess up, someone takes your spot, and you just get back in line to go back in!

### Ice Pops / Ice Cream

Each afternoon, every Camper gets a special, cold, summertime treat of the day. On Fridays we have special treats, like ice cream! Remember to respect the environment by putting your popsicle sticks and wrappers into the trash!



## Instructional and Free Swim

Every division has a free swim period each afternoon, with Campers choosing between swimming in the pool or the lake. Turtles, Frosh and Sophs also have an instructional swim lesson period each day. Campers are grouped by swim ability, mostly with kids from the same camper Group. Swim instructors help you improve your swimming skills, so you can move up to higher swim levels. Swim directors Email home progress cards each week. Juniors and Seniors can pick extra swim electives like Instructional Swim, Swim Team and "Polar Bear Club," and Jr. Lifesaving for Seniors!



### Joe (in the office)

Joseph Craig is the Camp Director that oversees administration, and has been working in the office for over 20 years helping families with the enrollment, finances, bus transportation, and schedule changes that occur throughout the year. ### Lanyard

Lanyard (also known to many as gimp) is thin plastic rope that comes in every color imaginable. Some stitch examples are: box, barrel, cobra, and Chinese staircase. Lanyards can be made into friendship bracelets, anklets, key chains and cool gifts for friends and family. Lanyard is available during free choice, before/after-care, art electives, and a great way to be creative!

**The Lagoon** is the tent just past boating, the hub for CIT training- Private & cool out there!

**L.A.R.P.** the abbreviation for "Live Action Role Play" - an epic battle of strategy, determination, PVC, foam, and duct-tape- on par with the Braveheart movie. The highlight of the summer for many, LARP is an opportunity for campers to show their teamwork and valor at the highest levels within the "Will's World" elective.



**Liberty Lake Foundation** is a nonprofit organization inspired by the values of camp, dedicated to providing opportunities for kids to learn, grow, and succeed. **Look-a-Like Contest** is an annual event in which campers and staff find people that look like them. Many people come dressed the same in costumes!

The "twins" get their picture taken, and then the WHOLE CAMP votes on who looks most alike!



**The Liberty Lake Song** is sung by the entire Camp every Friday afternoon in the Summer at the Lakeside Amphitheater- with the help of a live, hot-rockin "house band". The rest of the year, we can't get this darn song out of our heads...(sorry!) Check it out on the Friday afternoon videos and cool lyric video on YouTube, and in the annual Video Yearbook. *It might be the best song that Andy ever wrote!*

**Liquid Sunshine** is what we call "Rain" at Liberty Lake, but it's never raining at LLDC until Andy says it is! Camp is about doing things that you don't normally do at home, and that includes safely playing in the Liquid Sunshine. Some of the best memories and creative moments happen on "rainy days." On the few days of Liquid Sunshine, be sure to wear your bad sneakers, because you might be coming home wet and MUDDY!!!!



**Lunch** is a divisional period each day. You will tell your group leader each morning whether you want the main entrée of the day, or a choice of sandwiches. Older kids can always go right up to the pasta and salad bar and help themselves! The pasta bar has buttered noodles and marinara sauce. When your group meets for lunch at assigned tables, there will be pitchers of water to drink, and your group leader will pick up the group's tray with pre-ordered choices. If you're still hungry, you can always go up to the lunch counter to get seconds. Turtles do "Family Style" with a tray of everything. There is plenty of food- so don't leave hungry. After we eat, we practice responsibility and respect as each group cleans up their area. Pre-assigned "cruisers" (a rotation within the group of campers) make sure the tables are clean before you leave. Friends don't let friends eat on dirty tables!

### Magic Cards

Imagination runs rampant at this unconventional card playing elective. No Jacks, Queens & Kings... Instead, campers have a deck of characters with a variety of powers. Battles are fast and furious, and from the look of things, it seems like a very enjoyable and addictive activity! Sophs can also play Poke'Mon. You can bring your own cards at your own risk (don't bring valuable ones!) or use Camp cards. We usually have a big "Magic Tournament" near the end of the summer, and hundreds of campers and staff who live playing Magic at camp each summer!

## Monday Assembly

Every Monday morning, the entire Camp gathers at the Liberty Lakeside Amphitheater (just like Fridays). At this assembly though, we sing the WAKE-UP SONG, welcome new campers, announce the week's Spirit Events, and raise the American Flag. We also discuss the Star Point of the week **\*\*\*So don't forget- On Mondays, we head down to the Amphitheater!**

## Office Team

The Liberty Lake office is the heart of communications for camp families, campers and Staff. Luckily we have a dynamic, veteran crew of dedicated "indoor" folks- **Joe**, who runs the office throughout the year, assisted by long time Liberty Laker **Taylor**, with **Tracy** scheduling the electives, **Victoria** coordinating the buses, and **Jill** holding operations together and keeping the camp running smoothly.

## Parent Pick-Up

If you don't take a bus to and from Camp then your parents will drop you off and pick you up. The drop-off spot is in front of the "Twin Cedars" Pavilion. At the end of the day, after the bus kids get on their buses, parents stop at the gate house and show their **Camp Placard** (your identification that will come in the mail). Your name will then be announced over the loudspeaker, and you will be escorted to your parent's car as they approach the Twin Cedars. Early pick-up/Late drop-off takes place at the gatehouse.

**Picnics** – While Liberty Lake Day Camp has been around for 25 years, our weekend picnic business has been around for 50 years, hosting family reunions, corporate parties, charity fundraisers, and other fun events on the weekends. **The Point** is the pavilion "behind the backwards bridge", home for Guitar, Drums & Rock Band- can get a little loud sometimes!

**Polar Bear Club** – The popular, cool (literally) elective for Juniors & Seniors at the deep side of the lake each morning-

## Safety Drills

To make sure that we are prepared in case of an emergency, we have Safety Drills during the season. A loud horn will sound repeatedly. When we hear that specific sound, EVERYONE goes directly to the blacktop in front of the office. We find our division and group leader, and line up with our group. The "All Clear" sound lets us know that we can return to the activities that we came from. We also have a "scatter drill" in which we all quickly head to the wooded areas on the outskirts of Camp.

## Senior Soiree'

Created because of ideas and feedback from Senior Campers, this is a "free-form" elective where seniors can hang out with their friends while listening to music, playing board games and participating in other friendly competitions and games. This elective serves as important "down time" for our oldest campers to strengthen their camp relationships.

**Senior / Teen Dance** is the annual event that takes place week 8 and is one of the highlights of the summer for many of our oldest campers. Staff and kids go home, shower, get dressed up, and come back to camp to PARTY! The lunch tent turns into a disco club, and the DJ plays the tunes that make your body groove! Pick-up is at 9pm, and don't be late, because we have camp the next day!



**Slushies** are icy, sweet drinks given out at the Snack Shack as birthday treats (please don't send food because of allergies), as well as prizes for exceptional accomplishments. The big question at Camp is – What is your favorite slushie flavor? Campers will do most ANYTHING for the opportunity to choose one of the 10 yummy flavors, and are eager to cash in the Slushie Birthday Cards mailed home to all returning campers!

## Snack Shack

The home of the Slushies, as well as afternoon ice creams, snacks- like pretzels, and spirit-wear clothing, like hats, shirts, and hoodies. Even though campers can drink water at one of our water fountains and ice water jugs (with filtered water) at every activity area in Camp, they can visit the Snack Shack between periods to purchase bottled water, juices, Gatorades and other natural drinks.

## Specialists

Specialists are the talented staff who run most of the elective activities at Camp, like Athletics, Fine & Performing Arts, STEM, and Adventure. Most are schoolteachers who work with children year-round. They are specially trained and/or have advanced skills in the area that they teach at Camp. They work with BC on cool new ideas to entice the campers, and teach them skills about their area of expertise, and character!

**Spirit Calendar** (*Special Events*) Every day of the summer is a different Spirit Event at LLDC. Some days are big parties, some are competitions, and some are just dress up days. Participating in these events develops teamwork & builds confidence by challenging our comfort levels. **Star Points** are character traits to help us become upstanding, contributing members of society by focusing on five main values: *FRIENDSHIP, TEAMWORK, INDEPENDENCE, ASPIRATION and INTEGRITY*. We work on these throughout the summer, at activities, and in-between times. Each week there is a “Star Point of the Week” that we focus on, and we look for the positive behaviors from our character values ALL THE TIME.

**Success Team** includes our Nurses, Dietary Specialist, Behavioral Support, and an Inclusion (special needs) Team who work with our campers and staff to provide extra support, to those who need it. At Liberty Lake, we are ALL part of the Success Team. Our Success Team works hard to ensure that all campers can have the same opportunities to try new things, make new friends, learn and grow while at camp!

**Swim-a-Thon**

Each summer, during our “Foundation Celebration,” Liberty Lakers swim as many laps as we can in order to raise money for the Liberty Lake Foundation, as well as Project Morry, and SCOPE- foundations created to support all kids to attend Camp. On this day, try your best and see how many laps that you can swim because all the money you raise goes towards great causes, and people who really appreciate your efforts!

**TASTE BUDS** is the tasty, cool name for our COOKING elective, which Andy calls the “eating” elective!

**Teen Leadership Program** are **CITs** (*Campers-in-Transition and entering 9<sup>th</sup> grade*) & **LITs** (*Leaders- in-Training entering 10<sup>th</sup> grade*). CITs and LITs participate in daily workshops, participate in service projects, and challenge themselves to step out of their comfort zone. The Teen Leadership Program believes strong leaders have strong character values and the whole camp supports our teens as they aspire to succeed!



**Tower of Power** is our 25-foot rock climbing wall with four different climbing paths to get to the top, and everyone can try to climb it- Even Turtles!

**Tug o’ War**

Groups show real teamwork as they battle like Roman warriors at the lakeside! Losers end up head-first in a whole lot of sticky, slimy mess like Jello, chocolate pudding, or mud! Sheer, utter awesomeness. Other than teamwork, this activity also shows campers how much fun it can be to try something different, even if it seems a bit strange at first. We rinse off afterward in the lake (and subsequently feed the fish.)



**Turtle Town** is our little village on the far side of the lake, created specifically for our youngest campers. We are big believers in the importance of unstructured, creative play, as well as short and quick activity stations, so Turtle Town was designed to foster imagination and develop important social skills.

**Twin Cedars** is the “top pavilion” where Freshmen and Turtles meet, and Before/Aftercare is centered. During the Camp day, it’s used for “Ooey Goey” and our “Photography” elective.

**The Vista** is the best view of Liberty Lake- where the Teen Leadership LITs hone their leadership skills

**Water Trampoline** is found on the deep side of the lake for high jumping, bouncing and splashing. You can choose to go on the water trampoline during Free Swim, and Juniors & Seniors can also choose it at the “Polar Bear Club.”



**Willows** is the pavilion “across the bridge”. It’s the home of Will’s World, Tabletop Games, Magic Cards- and an important place during “Liquid Sunshine” for campers to safely play. It’s the largest Pavilion at LLDC!

**Woods** is the beautiful, shady pavilion at the end of the “Woods Walk,” past fishing, towards the High Ropes. It’s the summer home of STEM, Spa, Dinos, and “liquid sunshine movies!”

### **Wilderness Skills** *(late stay or overnight)*

A wonderful elective to explore the outside world without technology- with our bare hands- as well as how to utilize nature to survive and thrive in the outdoors. Campers participate in an optional late night (Sophs) or overnight (Juniors and older) during the summer. For those who can brave the darkness, and enjoy “roughing it,” it’s a great night of outdoor cooking, campfire songs, marshmallows and fun. We do one night for the girls, and one for the boys- check the Spirit Calendar!

**Will’s World** is the home of our longtime specialist Will Lewis, and his like-minded camper followers, who embrace the world of fantasy and controlled combat. **L.A.R.P.** (live action role play), Dungeons & Dragons, Magic Cards and more- Will & his minions literally “live the dream” at LLDC!

### **Yacht or Not**

Perhaps the greatest annual spirit event of the summer, groups are given a large cardboard garment box and a roll of duct tape, with the goal to create a boat that can not only float, but carry their Group Leader in a race in the lake! TEAMWORK and COLLABORATION run rampant! The actual race is one of the craziest, most entertaining 20 seconds you can imagine. Get your boat out quick if you win- As you’ll need to dry it out for the camp-wide finals at the end of the day!
